## Winter Hats for Everyone

Kid's Dragon Hat

Designed by Michele Wilcox
Dress up your little guy in this free crochet pattern shaped like a magical dragon from Red Heart Yarn. This adorable hat is great for a Halloween, but can be used any time of the year to help spark young imaginations during play time.

Hat measures 18 " in circumference. Fits Child's size 2-4 years.


## Materials:

- RED HEART® "Super Saver ${ }^{\oplus}$ ": 1 skein each 672 Spring Green A, 254 Pumpkin B and 324 Bright Yellow C.
- Crochet Hook: 4 mm [US G-6].
- Polyfill Stuffing
- Yarn Needle.

Gauge: $5 \mathrm{dc}=11 / 2^{\prime \prime} ; 3$ Rounds $\mathrm{dc}=11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

## SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

sc2tog: [Draw up a loop in next st] twice, yo and draw through all 3 loops on hook.

## HAT

Beginning at top of hat with $\mathbf{A}$, ch 4 ; join into a ring with slip st in first ch.
Round 1: Ch 3 (counts as dc here and
throughout), 11 dc in ring; join with a slip st in top of beginning ch 3-12 dc.
Round 2: Ch 3, dc in first st, 2 dc in each dc around; join with a slip st in top of beginning ch 3 -24 dc .
Round 3: Ch 3, 2 dc in next dc, *dc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc; repeat from * around, join with a slip st in top of beginning ch $3-36 \mathrm{dc}$.
Round 4: Ch 3, dc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc, *dc in next $2 \mathrm{dc}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc; repeat from * around, join with a slip st in top of beginning ch 3 -48 dc .
Round 5: Ch 3, dc in next $2 \mathrm{dc}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc, *dc in next $3 \mathrm{dc}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc; repeat from * around, join with a slip st in top of beginning ch 3 -60 dc .
Rounds 6-13: Ch 3, dc in each dc around, join with a slip st in top of beginning ch 3 .
Round 14: Ch 1, sc in same st as joining, *skip 2 $\mathrm{dc}, 5 \mathrm{sc}$ in next dc, skip 2 dc , sc in next dc, repeat from * around, join with a slip st in top of beginning ch 3 . Fasten off.
Hat Scales (make 2)
With B, ch 43.
Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across, turn - 42 sc .

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in next 6 sc, turn.
Row 3: Ch 1, sc2tog over next 2 sc , sc in next 2 sc, sc2tog over next 2 sc , turn.
Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
Row 5: Ch 1, [sc2tog over next 2 sc ] twice, turn.
Row 6: Ch 1, sc2tog over next 2 sc , work 4 sc evenly spaced down side of scale.
Row 7: Sc in next 6 sc in Row 1.
Repeat Rows 3-7 (5 times); then repeat Rows 3-6 once, turn.
Joining Row: With wrong sides of hat scales together, ch 1, working through double thickness, sc evenly across top of scales, working 3 sc in top of each scale, leaving bottom open. Stuff each scale very lightly then sew scales in place on top of hat.

## Tail

With $\mathbf{A}$, ch 2.
Round 1: 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, do not join.
Work in a spiral, marking beginning of each round, moving marker up as work progresses.
Round 2: Sc in each sc around.
Round 3: *Sc in next $2 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc; repeat from * around -8 sc .
Round 4: *Sc in next $3 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc ; repeat from * around - 10 sc.
Round 5: *Sc in next $4 \mathrm{sc}, 2$ sc in next sc; repeat from * around - 12 sc.
Round 6: Sc in each sc around.
Round 7: *Sc in next $3 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc ; repeat from * around - 15 sc.
Rounds 8-9: Sc in each sc around.
Round 10: *Sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around - 18 sc.
Rounds 11-12: Sc in each sc around.
Round 13: *Sc in next $5 \mathrm{sc}, 2$ sc in next sc; repeat from * around - 21 sc .
Rounds 14-27: Sc in each sc around. Fasten off.

## Tail Scales

With B, ch 26.
Row 1: Slip st in 2nd ch from hook, ch 1, *3 dc in next ch, skip next ch, slip st in next ch**, ch 1; repeat from * across, ending last repeat at ${ }^{* *}$.

Fasten off. Sew to top center of tail. Stuff tail and sew in place.
Large Spot (make 2)
With C, ch 2.
Round 1: 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, do not join, work in a spiral as before.
Round 2: 2 sc in each sc around - 12 sc .
Round 3: *Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around - 18 sc .
Round 4: *Sc in next $2 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc; repeat from * around -24 sc . Fasten off, leaving long sewing length.
Medium Spot (make 4)
Work same as Large Spot through Round 3. Fasten off, leaving long sewing length.
Small Spot (make 2)
Work same as Large Spot through Round 2. Fasten off, leaving long sewing length. Randomly arrange spots on each side of hat and sew in place.

## Strawberry Beret and Wrist

## Warmers

Designed by Kim Guzman

Your little girl will look adorable in this Strawberry Beret and Wrist Warmers set from Red Heart Yarn! You can crochet hats for kids with ease, and this is a great one to practice with. This set has a feminine flair, so she'll love dressing up with these accessories!

Directions are for girl's size 2-4 (S). Changes for size 6-8 (L) are in parentheses.

Finished measurements: Hat: 16 (18)" in circumference.
Hat: 8.5 (10)" in diameter
Wristers: $23 / 4(31 / 4)^{\prime \prime}$ wide; $3(31 / 2)^{\prime \prime}$ long.


## Materials:

- RED HEART ${ }^{\circledR}$ With Love ${ }^{\text {TM }} 1$ skein each 1703 Candy Pink A and 1807
Boysenberry B.
- Crochet Hook: 6.5mm [US K-10½].
- Yarn needle

GAUGE: 16 sts \& 14 rows = 4" CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

## SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

shell: (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc ) in same space. sc2tog: [Insert hook in next st, yo, draw yarn through st] twice, yo, draw yarn through 3 loops on hook.
dc2tog: [Yo, insert hook in next st, yo, draw yarn through st, yo, draw through 2 loops on hook] twice, yo, draw through 3 loops on hook.

## PATTERN NOTES:

When working rows in back loop only, if your last st is a little loose, try working the last st into both loops of st.

## HAT

Band
With A, leaving a 8" sewing length, ch 5 (7).
Row 1: Working in back bar of each ch, slip st in 2nd ch from hook, slip st in each ch across; turn-4 (6) slip sts.
Row 2: Working in back loops only, slip st in each st across, turn-4 (6) slip sts.
Repeat row 2 until 106 (114) rows have been worked or band measures 14 (15)" from beginning. Do not fasten off.
Rotate to begin working along sides of rows. Work now progresses in rounds.
Crown
Round 1 (right side): Ch 1, work 64 (80) sc evenly spaced across side edge of band; join with a slip st in first sc.
Round 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout), skip first sc, dc in each sc around; join with a slip st in top of beginning ch-3-64 (80) dc. Fasten off A.

Round 3: With right side facing, join B with a slip st in top of beginning ch-3, ch 1, sc in same st, *ch 2, skip 1 dc, sc in next dc; repeat from * around to last dc, ch 2 , skip last dc; join with a slip st in first sc-32 (40) ch-2 spaces.
Round 4: Slip st in next ch-2 space, ch 1, sc in same ch-2 space, *shell in next ch-2 space**, sc in next ch-2 space; repeat from * around, ending last repeat at ${ }^{* *}$; join with a slip st in first sc-16 (20) shells. Fasten off B.

Round 5: With right side facing, join A with a slip st in ch-2 space of any shell, ch 1 , sc in same space as joining, ch 5 , (sc, ch 5 ) in each ch-2 space around; join with a slip st in first sc-16 (20) ch-5 spaces.
Round 6: Slip st in next ch-5 space, ch 1, 5 sc in each ch-5 space around; join with a slip st in first sc-80 (100) sc.
Round 7: Ch 3, skip first sc, dc in each sc around; join with a slip st in top of beginning ch-3-80 (100) dc.

## Size L Only

Round 8: Ch 3, skip first dc, dc in each of next 2 dc, dc2tog over next 2 sts, *dc in each of next 3 dc, dc2tog over next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with a slip st in top of beginning ch-3-80 dc.

## Both Sizes

Round 8 (9): Ch 1, sc in first st, sc in next 7 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts, *sc in next 8 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with a slip st in first sc-72 sts.
Round 9 (10): Ch 1, sc in first st, sc in next 6 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts, *sc in next 7 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with a slip st in first sc-64 sts.
Round 10 (11): Ch 1, sc in first st, sc in next 5 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts, *sc in next 6 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with a slip st in first sc-56 sts.
Round 11 (12): Ch 1, sc in first st, sc in next 4 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts, *sc in next 5 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with a slip st in first sc-48 sts.
Round 12 (13): Ch 1, sc in first st, sc in next 3 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts, *sc in next 4 sts, sc2tog
over next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with a slip st in first sc-40 sts.
Round 13 (14): Ch 1, sc in first st, sc in next 2 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts, *sc in next 3 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with a slip st in first sc-32 sts.
Round 14 (15): Ch 1, sc in first st, sc in next st, sc2tog over next 2 sts, *sc in next 2 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with a slip st in first sc-24 sts.
Round 15 (16): Ch 1, sc in first sc, sc2tog over next 2 sts, *sc in next sc, sc2tog over next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with a slip st in first sc-18 sts.
Round 16 (17): Ch 1, *sc2tog over next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with a slip st in first sc-9 sts.
Round 17 (18): Ch 1, sc in first sc, *sc2tog over next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with a slip st in first sc-5 sts. Fasten off leaving a sewing length. With yarn needle, weave sewing length through tops of sts in last round, gather top and secure.

## FINISHING

With yarn needle and sewing length, sew brim seam.
Weave in ends.

## WRISTERS (make 2)

## Wrist Band

With A, leaving a 8" sewing length, ch 7 (9).
Row 1 Working in back bar of each ch, slip st in
2nd ch from hook, slip st in each ch across; turn-6 (8) slip sts.
Row 2: Working in back loops only, slip st in each st across, turn-6 (8) slip sts.
Repeat row 2 until 38 (42) rows have been worked or band measures $5(51 / 2)^{\prime \prime}$ from beginning. Do not fasten off.
Rotate to begin working alongside edge of wrist band.
Work now progresses in rounds.
Round 1 (right side): Ch 1, work 16 (20) sc evenly spaced across side edge of band; join with a slip st in back loop only of first sc.
Round 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout), working in back loops only, skip
first sc, dc in each sc around; join with a slip st in top of beginning ch-3-16 (20) dc.
Round 3: Ch 1, sc in first st, *ch 2, skip next dc, sc in next dc; repeat from * around to last dc, ch 2, skip last dc; join with a slip st in first sc-8(10) ch-2 spaces.
Round 4: Slip st in next ch-2 space, ch 1, sc in first ch-2 space, *shell in next ch-2 space**, sc in next ch-2 space; repeat from * around ending last repeat at ${ }^{* *}$; join with a slip st in first sc-4 (5) shells. Fasten off A.

Round 5: With right side facing, join $B$ to remaining front loop of any sc in Round 1, ch 1, sc in same st as joining, *ch 2, skip next sc, sc in next sc; repeat from * around to last sc, ch 2, skip last sc; join with a slip st in first sc-8
(10) ch-2 spaces.

Round 6: Repeat round 4. Fasten off B. FINISHING
With yarn needle and sewing length, sew wrist band seam.
Weave in ends.

## Little Boy's Hat and Scarf Set

Designed by Tracie Barrett

Bundle up your little one with this Little Boy's Hat and Scarf Set from Red Heart Yarn. This is great if you're heading out for a snowball fight or to go sledding in the park. Knitting for children is a fun way to learn new knitting techniques as well.

Directions are for size Small. Changes for size Medium are in parentheses.

Scarf measures 5 ( $61 / 2)^{\prime \prime}$ wide x $411 / 2(51)^{\prime \prime}$ long (without fringe). Hat measures 18 (20)" circumference by 8 " long (without pompom).


## Materials:

- Red Heart ${ }^{\circledR}$ With Love ${ }^{\text {TM }}: 1$ skein each 1401 Pewter A and 1601 Lettuce B.
- Crochet Hooks: 5.5mm [US I-9] and 6 mm [US J-10].
- Yarn needle.

GAUGES: 13 sts $=4 \prime \prime ; 11$ rounds $=4 \prime$ with smaller hook.
12 sts $=4^{\prime \prime} ; 10$ rows $=4^{\prime \prime}$ with larger hook. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.
NOTES: Carry color not in use up inside of hat and up side of scarf after changing colors. Ch 2 does NOT count as a stitch.

## HAT

## Color Sequence

Following instructions below, work in the following color sequence: [2 rounds $A, 2$ rounds B] twice, 3 (4) rounds $\mathbf{A}, 4$ rounds $B, 5$ (4) rounds $\mathbf{A}, 2$ rounds $\mathbf{B}$, [1 round $\mathbf{A}, 1$ round $\mathbf{B}$ ] twice, 1 round $\mathbf{A}$.
With smaller hook and $\mathbf{A}$, ch 2.
Round 1 (Right Side): 8 hdc in 2nd ch from hook; join with a slip st to first hdc.
Round 2: Ch 2, 2 hdc in each hdc around; join in first hdc - 16 hdc.
Round 3: Ch 2, [hdc in first hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 8 times; join - 24 hdc.
Round 4: Ch 2, hdc in each hdc around; join
Round 5: Ch 2, [hdc in next 2 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 8 times; join - 32 hdc.
Round 6: Ch 2, hdc in each hdc around; join.
Round 7: Ch 2, [hdc in next 3 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 8 times; join - 40 hdc.
Round 8: Ch 2, [hdc in next 4 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 8 times; join - 48 hdc.
Round 9: Ch 2, hdc in each hdc around; join.
Round 10: Ch 2, [hdc in next 5 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 8 times; join - 56 hdc.

## Size Medium Only

Round (11): Ch 2, [hdc in next 6 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 8 times; join - 64 hdc.

## Both Sizes

Round 11 (12): Ch 2, hdc in each hdc around; join.

Rounds 12-20 (13-20): Ch 2, hdc in each hdc around; join.
Round 21: Ch 2, hdc in front loop of each hdc
around; join.
Rounds 22-26: Ch 2, hdc in each hdc around; join. TURN at end of Round 26.
Round 27: Ch 1, sc in each hdc around; join.
Fasten off.

## Finishing

Weave in ends. Using both $\mathbf{A}$ and $\mathbf{B}$, make a $4^{\prime \prime}$ pom pom; attach to hat. Fold brim up at Round 21.

## SCARF

## Color Sequence

Following instructions below, work in the following color sequence: [ 2 rows $\mathbf{A}, 2$ rows $\mathbf{B}$ ] twice, * [4 rows $\mathbf{A}, 4$ rows $B$ ] twice, [ 2 rows $A, 2$ rows $\mathbf{B}]$ twice; repeat from * 3 (4) more times. With larger hook and A, ch 16 (20).
Row 1 (Right Side): Hdc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across; turn - 15 (19) hdc.
Row 2: Ch 2, hdc in each hdc across; turn.
Rows 3-104 (128): Repeat Row 2. Do not fasten off at end of last row, but turn to work edging.

## Edging

Ch 1, sc evenly around scarf, working 3 sc in corners; join with a slip st in first sc. Fasten off.

## Finishing

Fringe
Cut 30 (38) $6^{\prime \prime}$ pieces each of $\mathbf{A}$ and $\mathbf{B}$. Using one strand of each color in each stitch across both short ends, attach fringe along short edges of scarf: fold yarn in half forming a loop; insert the crochet hook through the fabric from the wrong side and draw the loop through, then draw the yarn ends through the loop and tighten.

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## Brim Hat for Him

## Designed by Sharon Mann

Next time you're wondering what to get the man in your life, consider this Brim Hat for Him from Red Heart Yarn. Beanie caps for men are easy projects when you're just learning to crochet, and he'll love that you put in the time to make him something!

Hat circumference at bottom edge: 19 ".


## Materials:

- RED HEART ${ }^{\text {© "Soft Yarn": }} 1$ Ball 9440 Light Grey Heather.
- Crochet Hook: 5mm [US H-8].
- Heavy-weight interfacing or plastic for brim
- Stitch marker
- Yarn needle.

GAUGE: $16 \mathrm{sc}=4$ " ${ }^{\prime \prime} 15$ rows = 4". CHECK YOUR
GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.
NOTE: Hat is worked in continuous rounds. Place marker for beginning of round.

## HAT

Crown
Ch 4, slip st in first ch to form ring. Place marker for beginning of round.
Round 1: Work 6 sc in ring -6 sts.
Round 2: Work 2 sc in each st around -12 sts.
Round 3: [ 2 sc in next st, sc in next st] - 18 sts.
Round 4: [ 2 sc in next st, sc in next 2 sts] -24 sts.
Round 5: [2 sc in next st, sc in next 3 sts] - 30 sts.
Round 6: [ 2 sc in next st, sc in next 4 sts] -36 sts.
Round 7: [2 sc in next st, sc in next 5 sts] -42 sts.
Round 8: [ 2 sc in next st, sc in next 6 sts ] -48 sts.
Round 9: Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout), dc in same space, dc in next 7 sts, [2 dc in next st, dc in next 7 sts] - 54 sts.
Round 10: [2 sc in next st, sc in next 8 sts] - 60 sts.
Round 11: [2 sc in next st, sc in next 9 sts] - 66
sts.
Round 12: [2 sc in next st, sc in next 10 sts ] - 72 sts.
Round 13: [2 sc in next st, sc in next 11 sts] - 78 sts.
Round 14: Ch 3, dc in each st around.
Rounds 15-18: Sc in each st around.
Rounds 19-28: Repeat Rounds 14-18.
Round 29: Hdc in each st around, slip st in first st.
Fasten off.

## Brim

## Top Side

Mark 22 sts on front of Hat on Round 29 for Brim.
Row 1: With right side facing, join yarn in first marked st, working in front loops only, sc in each next 22 sts.
Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in back loops in next 4 sts on Hat - 26 sts.
Row 3: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in front loops in next 4 sts on Hat - 30 sts.

Row 4: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in back loop in next st on Hat - 31 sts.
Row 5: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in front loop in next st on Hat - 32 sts.
Row 6: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in back loop in next st on Hat - 33 sts.
Row 7: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in front loop in next st on Hat - 34 sts.
Fasten off.

## Bottom Side

Row 1: With wrong side facing, join yarn on
wrong side of
Row 1 of Brim, sc in back loops of first 22 sts.
Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in front loops in next 4 sts on Hat - 26 sts.
Row 3: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in back loops in next 4 sts on Hat - 30 sts.
Row 4: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in front loop in next st on Hat - 31 sts.
Row 5: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in back loop in next st on Hat - 32 sts.
Row 6: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in front loop in next st on Hat - 33 sts.
Row 7: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in back loop in next st on Hat - 34 sts.
Fasten off.

## FINISHING

Using Brim as a template, cut a piece of stiff interfacing or plastic to same dimensions. Slip piece in between layers of Brim and sew Brim closed.
Weave in ends.

## Adam's Rib Cap

Men of all ages will like this Adam's Rib Cap from Red Heart Yarn. It's one size fits most, so there's no need to go around measuring everyone's head! This is a great beginner project for those who are new to knitting.

Hat will fit most men.


## Materials:

- RED HEART ${ }^{\circledR}$ Super Tweed ${ }^{\text {™ }}$ : 1 skein 7803 Blue Bayou.
- Knitting Needles: 4.5 mm [US 7].
- Yarn needle.

GAUGES: 19 sts = 4"; 24 rows = 4" in rib, unstretched.
16 sts = 4"; 24 rows $=4$ " in rib, slightly stretched.
CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needles to obtain the gauge.

Circumference, slightly stretched $=22-24^{\prime \prime}$.

## Special Abbreviation:

ssk (slip, slip, knit) = slip next 2 sts knitwise, one at a time, to right needle, insert tip of left needle into these 2 sts from the front and knit together.

## HAT

Cast on 97 sts.
Row 1 (Right Side): K1, * P1, K1; repeat from * across.
Row 2: P1, * K1, P1; repeat from * across.
Rows 3-8: Repeat Rows 1 and 2 three more times.
Row 9: * K2, P2; repeat from * to last st; K1.
Row 10: P1, * K2, P2; repeat from * across.
Repeat Rows 9 and 10 until piece measures $63 / 4$ " from beginning, or desired length to crown, end wrong side row.
Crown
Decrease Row 1: * K2, P2tog; repeat from * to last st; K1-73 sts.
Row 2: P1, * K1, P2; repeat from * across.
Row 3: * K2, P1; repeat from * to last st; K1.
Row 4: Repeat Row 2.
Rows 5 and 6: Repeat Rows 3 and 4.
Decrease Row 7: * SSK, P1; repeat from * to last st; K1-49 sts.
Row 8: P1, * K1, P1; repeat from * across.
Row 9: K1, * P1, K1; repeat from * across.
Row 10: Repeat Row 8.
Decrease Row 11: * SSK; repeat from * to last st; K1-25 sts.
Row 12: Purl.
Decrease Row 13: Repeat Row 11 - 13 sts.
Row 14: Purl.
Decrease Row 15: Repeat Row 11-7 sts.
Cut yarn leaving an $18^{\prime \prime}$ tail. Thread tail through remaining sts and pull tight to close top.
Sew seam $1 / 2$ stitch from edge on each side and weave in ends.

## Beginner's Favorite Knitted Hat

Hat measures 18 inches around (slightly stretched). Fits most adults.


## Materials:

- Red Heart ${ }^{\circledR}$ With Love ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ : 1 skein 1252

Mango.

- Knitting Needles: 6 mm [US 10].
- Yarn needle.

GAUGE: 16 sts = 4"; 20 rows = 4" in ribbing, slightly stretched. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needles to obtain the gauge.

HAT
Cast on 70 sts.
Row 1 (Wrong Side): *Purl 2, knit 2; repeat from * to last 2 stitches, purl 2.

Row 2 (Right Side): *Knit 2, purl 2; repeat from * to last 2 stitches, knit 2.
Repeat Rows 1 and 2 until work measures 10 inches from beginning, ending with a wrong side row.
Shape Crown
Row 1 (Right Side): *Knit 2, purl 2 together (decrease 1 stitch); repeat from * to last 2 stitches, knit 2-53 stitches.
Row 2 (Wrong Side): *Purl 2, knit 1; repeat from

* to last 2 stitches, purl 2.

Row 3: *Knit 2, purl 1; repeat from * to last 2 stitches, knit 2.
Row 4: Repeat Row 2.
Next Row: *Knit 2 together, purl 1; repeat from

* to last 2 stitches, knit $2-36$ stitches.

Next Row: Purl 2, *knit 1, purl 1; repeat from * to end.
Next Row: *Knit 2 together; repeat from * to end - 18 stitches.
Next Row: Purl.
Last Row: *Knit 2 together; repeat from * to end -9 sts.
Cut yarn leaving a long end for seaming.
Weave yarn through remaining stitches; gather stitches up firmly and secure. Sew the back seam. Starting about 3 inches from the bottom, sew the seam on the reverse side, as this will be turned up for the brim.

## Blooming Purple Beanie

This Blooming Purple Beanie from Red Heart Yarn is a great crochet hat for women. The beautiful flower on the side makes this fun and unique hat perfect for winter and spring! With this easy to follow pattern, you'll be making these colorful hats in tons of colors!

Hat measures 21 " circumference $\times 11^{\prime \prime}$ tall (unfolded). Flower measures 4" across (at widest).


## Materials:

- Stitch Nation by Debbie Stoller ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ "Washable Ewe ${ }^{\text {TM" }}: 1$ ball 3540 Currant.
- Crochet Hook: 5.5mm [US I-9].
- Yarn needle.

GAUGE: Round 1 of Hat = $11 / 2$ " across; Rounds 1 and 2 of Hat $=2 \frac{112 \prime \prime}{\prime \prime}$ across. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

Beg-Cl = Beginning Cluster - (first leg) Yo, insert hook in indicated st and draw up a loop, yo, and draw through 2 loops on hook; (2nd leg) yo, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop, yo and draw through 2 loops on hook, yo and draw through 3
remaining loops on hook.
$\mathrm{Cl}=$ Cluster -Yo , insert hook in indicated st and draw up a loop, yo and draw through 2 loops on hook, yo, insert hook in same st and draw up a loop, [yo and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice
(2 loops remain on hook).
2Cltog = 2 Cluster Together - (first leg) Cl in indicated st (2 loops remain on hook; (2nd leg) Cl in next indicated st (3 loops remain on hook), yo and draw through all 3 loops on hook.
3Cltog = 3 Cluster Together - (first leg) Cl in indicated st (2 loops remain on hook; (2nd leg) Cl in next indicated st (3 loops remain on hook); (3rd leg) Cl in next indicated st (4 loops remain on hook), yo and draw through all 4 loops on hook.
NOTE: Hat and flower are worked with right side facing at all times. Do not turn at the end of rounds.

## HAT

Ch 3; slip st in first ch from hook to form a ring. Round 1 (Right Side): Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout), 10 dc in ring; join with slip st in top of beginning ch-11 dc.
Round 2: Ch 3, dc in same st as join, 2 dc in each remaining dc around; join with slip st in top of beginning ch-22 dc.
Round 3: Ch 2, Beg-Cl working first leg in same st as join, ch 3, Cl in back bar of 3rd ch from hook (horizontal Cl made - 2 loops remain on hook), Cl in same st as 2 nd leg of previous Beg-Cl (3 loops remain on hook), Cl in next dc , yo and draw through all 4 loops on hook, *ch 3; 3Cltog working first leg in back bar of $3^{\text {rd }}$ ch from hook,

2nd leg in same dc as last leg of previous Cl , and 3rd leg in next dc; repeat from * 18 more times, ch 3; 3Cltog working first leg in back bar of 3rd ch from hook, 2 nd leg in same dc as last leg of previous Cl , and 3rd leg in slip st join of previous round; ch 3, Beg-Cl in back bar of 3rd ch from hook; join with slip st in base of first horizontal $\mathrm{Cl}-22$ horizontal Cl .
Rounds 4-12: Ch 2, 2Cltog working first leg in same st as join and 2 nd leg at base of next horizontal $\mathrm{Cl},{ }^{*}$ ch 3; 3Cltog working first leg in back bar of 3rd ch from hook, 2nd leg in same st as last leg of previous Cl , and 3rd leg in base of next horizontal Cl; repeat from * 18 more times, ch 3; 3Cltog working first leg in back bar of 3 rd ch from hook, 2nd leg in same st as last leg of previous Cl , and 3rd leg in slip st join of previous round, ch 3, Beg-Cl in back bar of 3rd ch from hook; join with slip st in base of first horizontal Cl-22 horizontal Cl.

Fasten off.

## FLOWER

Ch 3; slip st in first ch to form a ring.
Round 1: [Sc in ring, ch 3] 6 times; join with slip st in first ch-3 space-6 sc and 6 ch-3 spaces.
Round 2: Ch 1, 5 sc in each ch-3 space around; join with slip st in first sc-6 petals.
Round 3: Working behind the petals of Round 2, [slip st around post of next sc of Round 1, ch 3] 6 times; join with slip st in first ch-3 space.
Round 4: Ch 1, (sc, hdc, 3 dc , hdc, sc) in each ch3 space around; join with slip st in first sc-6 petals.
Round 5: Working behind petals of Round 4, ch 5, [skip next sc of Round 4, slip st around post of next sc of Round 4, ch 5] 5 times; join with slip st in first ch-5 space.
Round 6: Ch 1, (sc, hdc, 5 dc , hdc, sc) in each ch5 space around; join with slip st in first sc-6 petals.
Fasten off.

## FINISHING

Fold back brim. Using photograph as a guide, sew flower to hat.
Weave in ends.

## Cotton Candy Cap

Designed by Ann Regis

This Cotton Candy Cap from Red Heart Yarn looks sweet on any little girl! Kids crochet hat patterns are a great way to fine tune your crochet skills, and what little girl wouldn't love the bright colors in this hat? Try this sweet as sugar pattern today!

Hat circumference is $191 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.


## Materials:

- RED HEART ${ }^{\circledR}$ "Super Saver ${ }^{\circledR}$ ": 1 skein 310 Monet.
- Crochet Hook: 6.5mm [US K-10.5].
- Yarn needle.

GAUGE: 11 sts = 4"; 7 rounds = $4^{\prime \prime}$ in dc. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

## Special Abbreviation

fpdc (front post double crochet): yarn over, insert hook from front to back to front around the post of indicated stitch and draw yarn through, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice.

## HAT

Ch 5; join with a slip st to form a ring.
Round 1: Ch 3, 8 dc in ring; join with a slip st in top of ch-3-9 sts.
Round 2: Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, 2 dc in each dc around; join in top of ch-3-18 sts.
Round 3: Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, fpdc in next dc, [2 dc in next dc, fpdc in next dc] 8 times; join - 27 sts.
Round 4: Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, dc in next dc, fpdc around fpdc, [2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc, fpdc
around fpdc] 8 times; join - 36 sts.
Round 5: Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, dc in next $2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{fpdc}$ around fpdc, [2 dc in next dc, dc in next 2 dc, fpdc around fpdc] 8 times; join - 45 sts.
Round 6: Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 3 dc, fpdc around fpdc, [2 dc in next dc, dc in next 3 dc , fpdc around fpdc] 8 times; join - 54 sts.
Round 7: Ch 3, dc in next dc, fpdc in next dc, dc in next $2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{fpdc}$ around fpdc, [dc in next 2 dc , fpdc in next dc, dc in next 2 dc , fpdc around fpdc] 8 times; join - 54 sts.
Rounds 8-15: Ch 3, dc in next dc, fpdc around fpdc, [dc in next 2 dc, fpdc around fpdc] 17 times; join.
Brim-Round 16: Turn work so wrong side of hat is facing you; ch 3, dc in each st around; join.
Round 17: Ch 3, fpdc in next dc, [dc in next 2 dc , fpdc in next dc] 17 times, dc in last dc; join.
Rounds 18-20: Ch 3, fpdc around fpdc, [dc in next 2 dc, fpdc around fpdc] 17 times, dc in last dc; join.

Round 21: Ch 1, (slip st, ch 4, slip st) in next st, [slip st in next 2 dc , (slip st, ch 4, slip st) in next st] 17 times, slip st in last st; join in first slip st. Fasten off. Weave in ends.Turn hat right side out. Fold brim up. Optional: Tack lightly at 4 points to secure brim to hat.

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## Snowtracks Cap

Designed by Timothy Peters

Make this beautiful Snowtracks Cap from Red Heart Yarn and look stylish no matter what the weather throws your way. This trendy hat is the perfect go-to winter accessory.

Directions are for size Small; changes for sizes Medium/Large are in parentheses.
To Fit Head Circumference: 22" (24").
Size Small fits as a skullcap. Size Medium/Large fits as a beanie with upturned brim.


## Materials:

- STITCH NATION by Debbie Stoller ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ "Bamboo Ewe ${ }^{\text {тм" }: ~} 1$ ball 5410 Mercury.
- Circular Knitting Needles: 3.75 [US 5] and 4.5 mm [US 7] 16" long.
- Double Pointed Needles: 1 set 4.5 mm [US 7].
- Place marker
- Yarn needle.

GAUGE: 28 sts $=4^{\prime \prime} ; 26$ rounds $=4^{\prime \prime}$ in Rib, slightly stretched. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needle to obtain the gauge.

## Special Abbreviations

2/2 LPC = Slip next 2 sts to cable needle, hold to front; p2, k2 from cable needle.
2/2 RPC = Slip next 2 sts to cable needle, hold to back; k2, p2 from cable needle.
2/2 LC = slip next 2 sts to cable needle, hold to front; k2; k2 from cable needle.
2/2 RC = slip next 2 sts to cable needle, hold to back; k2; k2 from cable needle.
Ssk = Slip next 2 sts knitwise, one at a time to right needle; insert point of left needle into the fronts of these 2 sts and knit them together from this position.
Ssp = Slip next 2 sts knitwise, one at a time to right hand needle; pass them back to left hand needle and p2togtbl.

## Note

Hat is worked in the round. As stitches are decreased and no
longer fit on circular needle, divide them among 3 double pointed needles to complete.

K2, p2 Rib (worked over a multiple of 4 sts)
Round 1 (Right Side): * K2, p2; repeat from * around.
Repeat Round 1 for K2, p2 rib.

## CAP

With smaller needles, cast on 100 (120) sts. Place marker for beginning of round and join, being careful not to twist sts. Work in
K2, p2 rib for $11 / 2(31 / 2)^{\prime \prime}$.
Next Round (Inc): [(k2, p2) twice, k1, k into front and back of st, p1, p into front and back of $s t$, (k2, p2) twice] 5 (6) times-110 (132) sts
Next Round: Work even in rib pattern as established, purl increased sts.

## Setup Cable Pattern

Change to larger needles, begin with Round 1, work Cable pattern from chart or instructions below:
Round 1: [K2, p2, k2, p2, 2/2 LPC, 2/2 RPC, p2, k2, p2] 5 (6) times.
Round 2 and all even-numbered rounds: $K$ the knit sts and p the purl sts.
Round 3: [K2, p2, k2, p4, 2/2 LC, p4, k2, p2] 5 (6) times.
Round 5: [K2, p2, (2/2 LPC, 2/2 RPC) twice, p2] 5 (6) times.

Round 7: [K2, p4, 2/2 RC, p4, 2/2 RC, p4] 5 (6) times.
Round 9: [K2, p2, (2/2 RPC, 2/2 LPC) twice, p2] 5 (6) times.

Round 11: Repeat Round 3.
Round 13: Repeat Round 5.
Round 15: Repeat Round 7.
Round 17: Repeat Round 9.
Round 19: Repeat Round 3.
Rounds 20-22: $K$ the knit sts and $p$ the purl sts.
Round 23: Repeat Round 3.

Round 25: [K2, p2, k2, p2, 2/2 RPC, 2/2 LPC, p2, k2, p2] 5 (6) times.
Rounds 26-28: $K$ the knit sts and $p$ the purl sts.
Shape Crown
Round 1: [K2, (p2, k2) twice, ssp, p2tog, (k2, p2) twice] 5 (6) times-100 (120) sts.
Round 2 and even numbered rounds: $K$ the knit sts and $p$ the purl sts.
Round 3: [k2, p2tog, (k2, p2) 3 times, k2, p2tog] 5 (6) times. 90 (108) sts.
Round 5: [K2, p1, k2, p2tog, k2, p2, k2, p2tog, k2, p1] 5 (6) times-80 (96) sts.
Round 7: [K2, (p1, k2) twice, p2tog, (k2, p1)
twice] 5 (6) times-75 (90) sts.
Round 9: [(K2, p1) twice, ssk, p1, k2tog, p1, k2, p1] 5 (6) times-65 (78) sts.
Round 11: [K2, p1, ssk, (p1, k1) twice, p1, k2tog, p1] 5 (6) times-55 (66) sts.
Round 13: [K2tog, p1, (k1, p1) 4 times)] 5 (6) times-50 (60) sts.
Round 15: [Ssk, k1, p1, ssk, k1, p1, ssk] 5 (6) times-35 (42) sts.
Round 16: [K2, k2tog, k1, k2tog] 5 (6) times- 25 (30) sts.

Round 17: [K2tog, k1, k2tog] 5 (6) times-15 (18) sts.
Round 18: K2tog around, k1 (0)-8 (9) sts. FINISHING
Cut yarn leaving long tail. Thread tail through remaining sts and pull tightly to secure. Weave in yarn ends.

## Materials:

- RED HEART ${ }^{\text {© "Super Saver }}{ }^{\circledR}$ ": 1 skein 930 Lipstick.
- Knitting Needles: 5.5 mm [US 9].
- Yarn needle.

GAUGE: 16 sts $=4 " ; 20$ rows $=4$ " . CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

## HAT

Cast on 73 sts. Beginning with K row, work in St st, (Knit 1 row, Purl 1 row), until piece measures 7 " from beginning, ending with a $P$ row. Shape Top: [K2tog, K14, slip 1, K1, psso, place a marker on the needle] 4 times, K1. Next Row: Purl.
Next Row: [K2tog, K to 2 sts before marker, slip 1, K1, psso] 4 times, K1.
Repeat last 2 rows until 9 sts remain. Fasten off leaving a long end for weaving and sewing.
Weave through the remaining sts, draw up tight and fasten. Sew seam.
Weave in all ends.

## Scarves and Mittens

## Pretty Purple Neck Warmer

Designed by Linda Cyr
This Pretty Purple Neck Warmer from Red Heart Yarn is great for keeping you warm during those cold autumn and winter nights. Since it's shorter than a scarf, it's super quick to make! This knitted neck warmer is also great for wearing around the house. The little buttons add a cute touch and help to keep the warmer snug around your neck.

Scarf measures 31 " long and $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ wide.


## Materials:

- RED HEART® ${ }^{\circledR}$ Boutique ${ }^{\text {TM " }}$ Treasure ${ }^{\text {TM" }}: 1$ ball 1913 Spectrum
- Knitting Needles: 5 mm [US 8].
- Yarn needle

GAUGE: 16 sts = 4"; 30 rows = 4" in pattern st. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needles to obtain the gauge.

Note: When instructed to slip stitches, bring yarn to front of work and slip them purlwise.

## NECK WARMER

Cast on 25 sts.
Row 1 (Right Side): Slip 1, *[k1, p1] twice, k2; repeat from * to end of row.
Row 2: *Slip 1, [k1, p1] twice, k1; repeat from * to last st, k1.
Repeat last 2 rows until piece measures $291 /{ }^{\prime \prime}$ from beginning end with a Wrong Side row.
Next Row (buttonhole - Right Side): Slip 1, k1, p 1 , bind off next 3 sts; beginning with next st on left needle, [k1, p1] twice, $k 3$, p 1 , bind off next 3 sts; beginning with next st on left needle, [k1, p1] twice, k2.
Slip 1, [k1, p1] twice, k1, slip 1, cast on 3 sts over the bound-off sts, $\mathrm{p} 1, \mathrm{k} 1$, slip 1, [k1, p1] twice, k1, slip 1, cast on 3 sts over the bound-off sts, p1, k2.
Repeat Rows 1 and 2 until piece measures $31^{\prime \prime}$ from beginning. Bind off.
FINISHING
Lightly steam block scarf. Overlap ends and sew buttons opposite buttonholes. Weave in ends.

## Ocean Waves Scarf

Designed by Coats Design Team
Show off this beautiful Ocean Waves Scarf at your next major event. This easy decorative scarf from Red Heart Yarn looks stunning on anyone, and you won't believe how simple it is to make! The colors are great for the springtime and early summer months!

- Knitting Needles: 6.5 mm [US 10.5] circular needle, 29" long.
- Stitch markers
- Yarn needle

GAUGE: 14 sts = 4"; 28 rows = 4" in Garter st (knit every row). CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needles to obtain the gauge.

## Special Stitch

$\mathbf{k f b}$ (Knit into front and back) = Knit next st but do not remove from needle, knit into back loop of same st and remove from needle.

## Pattern Stitch

Ripple Pattern (over 11 sts)
Row 1: [K2tog] 2 times, [yo, k1] 3 times, yo, [k2tog] 2 times.
Row 2: Purl.
Row 3: Knit.
Rows 4 and 5: Repeat Rows 2 and 3.
Row 6: Knit.

SCARF
Cast on 129 sts.
Row 1: K4, place marker, knit to last 4 sts, place marker, k4.
Row 2: Knit, slipping markers as you come to them.
Repeat last row until 3 ridges (6 rows) have been worked, ending with a Wrong Side row.
Begin Ripple Pattern
Row 1 (Right Side): Knit to marker, slip marker, [work Row 1 of Ripple Pattern] 11 times, slip marker, knit to end of row.
Row 2: Kfb, knit to marker, slip marker, [work
Row 2 of Ripple Pattern] 11 times, slip marker, knit to last st, kfb-131 sts.
Row 3: Knit to marker, slip marker, [work Row 3 of Ripple Pattern] 11 times, slip marker, knit to end of row.
Row 4: Kfb, knit to marker, slip marker, [work
Row 4 of Ripple Pattern] 11 times, slip marker, knit to last st, kfb-133 sts.
Row 5: Knit to marker, slip marker, [work Row 5 of Ripple Pattern] 11 times, slip marker, knit to end of row.
Row 6: Kfb, knit to marker, slip marker, [work
Row 6 of Ripple Pattern] 11 times, slip marker, knit to last st, kfb-135 sts.
Rows 7-12: Repeat Rows 1-6—141 sts.
Rows 13-17: Repeat Rows 1-5-145 sts.

From Head to Toe, Young to Old: 26 Knit and Crochet Accessories

Row 18 (Wrong Side): K2tog, knit to marker, slip marker, [work next row of Ripple Pattern] 11 times, slip marker, knit to last 2 sts, k2tog-143
sts.
Row 19: Knit to marker, slip marker, [work next row of Ripple Pattern] 11 times, slip marker, knit to end of row.
Rows 20-33: Repeat last 2 rows 7 more times129 sts.
Last 6 Rows: Knit (for 3 ridges).
Bind off loosely.
FINISHING
Weave in ends.

## Breast Cancer Awareness Scarf

The pretty Breast Cancer Awareness Scarf from Red Heart Yarn is perfect for showing your support in October or anytime! The knitted cable scarf is reversible, with a unique cable pattern on both sides. Create one or a dozen and donate them to your local hospital.

Scarf measures $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 63$ " excluding fringe.


## Materials:

- RED HEART ${ }^{\circledR}$ Super Saver ${ }^{\circledR}$ : 1 skein 706 Perfect Pink.
- Knitting Needles: 6 mm [US 10].
- Cable needle
- Yarn needle.

GAUGE: 14 sts = 4"; 18 rows = 4" in St st. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needles to obtain the gauge.

## Special Abbreviations

M1 (make one stitch) = Lift running thread before next stitch onto left needle and knit into the back loop.
C6B = slip next 3 sts to cable needle and hold at back of work, k3, then k3 from cable needle.
C6F = slip next 3 sts to cable needle and hold at front of work, k3, then k3 from cable needle.
$\mathbf{C 1 0 B}=$ slip next 5 sts to cable needle and hold at back of work, k 5 , then k 5 from cable needle.
C10F = slip next 5 sts to cable needle and hold at front of work, k5, then k5 from cable needle.

## SCARF

Cast on 31 sts.
Foundation Row: K1, * p1, k1; repeat from * across.
Row 1 (Right Side): K1, [p1, k1] twice, k9, k1, p1, k1, k9, k1, [p1, k1] twice.
Row 2: K1, [p1, k1] twice, p9, k1, p1, k1, p9, k1, [p1, k1] twice.
Row 3: K1, [p1, k1] twice, k3, C6B, k1, p1, k1, k3, C6F, k1, [p1, k1] twice.
Rows 4 and 6: K1, [p1, k1] twice, p9, k1, p1, k1, p9, k1, [p1, k1] twice.
Row 5: K1, [p1, k1] twice, C6B, k3, k1, p1, k1, C6F, k3, k1, [p1, k1] twice.
Row 7: K1, [p1, k1] twice, k9, k1, p1, k1, k9, k1, [p1, k1] twice.
Row 8: Repeat Row 4.
Rows 9-16: Repeat Rows 7 and 8.
Row 17: K1, [p1, k1] twice, k3, C6F, k1, p1, k1, k3, C6B, k1, [p1, k1] twice.
Rows 18 and 20: Repeat Row 4.
Row 19: K1, [p1, k1] twice, C6F, k3, k1, p1, k1, C6B, k3, k1, [p1, k1] twice.
Rows 21-30: Repeat Rows 7 and 8.
Rows 31-34: Repeat Rows 3-6.
Row 35: K1, p1, C6B, k6, k1, p1, k1, k6, C6F, p1, k1.
Rows 36 and 38: K1, p1, p12, k1, p1, k1, p12, p1, k1.

Row 37: K1, p1, k12, k1, p1, k1, k12, p1, k1.
Rows 39-46: Repeat Rows 37 and 38.
Row 47: K1, p1, slip next 3 sts to cable needle and hold at front of work, k1, p1, k1, then k3 from cable needle, k6, k1, p1, k1, k6, slip next 3 sts to cable needle and hold at back of work, k3, then k1, p1, k1 from cable needle, p1, k1.
Rows 48, 50, and 52: K1, [p1, k1] twice, p9, k1, p1, k1, p9, k1, [p1, k1] twice.
Row 49: K1, [p1, k1] twice, k3, C6F, k1, p1, k1, k3, C6B, k1, [p1, k1] twice.
Row 51: K1, [p1, k1] twice, C6F, k3, k1, p1, k1, C6B, k3, k1, [p1, k1] twice.
Row 53: K1, [p1, k1] twice, k9, k1, p1, k1, k9, k1, [p1, k1] twice.
Row 54: Repeat Row 48.
Rows 55-62: Repeat Rows 53 and 54.
Repeat Rows 3-62 twice more and then repeat Rows 3-30 once more increasing 1 st in each "k9" section on next to- last row - 33 sts. Scarf should measure about $30^{\prime \prime}$ from beginning. Now work second cable pattern.
Row 1: K1, [p1, k1] twice, C10F, k1, p1, k1, C10B, k1, [p1, k1] twice.
Row 2: K1, [p1, k1] twice, p10, k1, p1, k1, p10, k1, [p1, k1] twice.
Row 3: K1, [p1, k1] twice, k10, k1, p1, k1, k10, k1, [p1, k1] twice.
Row 4: Repeat Row 2.
Rows 5-14: Repeat Rows 3 and 4.
Repeat Rows 1-14 thirteen more times, then repeat Row 1 again.
Next Row: K1, * p1, k1; repeat from * across. Bind off in Seed st pattern decreasing 2 sts across each cable by working "k2tog, then p2tog".
Fringe
Cut 10 " strands of yarn. Holding 5 strands together, knot 3 fringes at each corner as shown. Trim yarn ends.

## Scalloped Crocheted Scarf

Designed Red Heart Design Team
This Scalloped Crocheted Scarf from Red Heart Yarn can add a fun feminine touch to any wardrobe. This vibrant purple and turquoise scarf is perfect for those who are new to crochet. It's easy to make and really fun to show off!

Scarf measures 5" x 661/2".


## Materials:

- RED HEART ${ }^{\oplus}$ Shimmer ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ : 1 skein each 1536 Purple A, 1503 Turquoise B.
- Crochet Hook: 6.00 mm [J-10].
- Yarn needle.

GAUGE: 12 sts = 4"; 12 rows = 4" in half double crochet. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

## Special Abbreviations

Shell (sh) = Work 5 half double crochets in same stitch.
Notes
Chain 2 at the beginning or end of a row, does not count as a stitch.
To change colors in half double crochet, yarn over, insert the hook in the next stitch, yarn over with the new yarn and pull through both loop on hook. Continue working with the new yarn. When fastening off old yarn, leave tail 3 " tail to weave in.

## SCARF

With A, ch 202.
Row 1: In 3rd ch from hook, work hdc, work hdc in each ch across, changing to $\mathbf{B}$ in last st, ch 2; turn- 200 hdc.
Fasten off A.
Row 2: Hdc each in st across, changing to $\mathbf{A}$ in last st, ch 2; turn- 200 hdc. Fasten off B.
Row 3: Hdc in each st across, changing to $\mathbf{B}$ in last st, ch 2; turn.
Rows 4-11: Repeat last 2 rows alternating $B$ and A until 11 rows have been worked, ending with A. Ch 1; turn, slip st in back loop of each st along long edge, ch 2; turn.

## Shell Edging

Continuing with A, 4 hdc in first st, *skip 1 st, slip st in next st, sh in next st; repeat from * around entire scarf; join with slip st in first sh. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

Cozy Knit Watercolor Wristers

Designed by Cathy Payson
If you're a master at knit rib stitches, try your hand at making these cozy knit watercolor wristers from Red Heart Yarn. They are easy to make Christmas gifts and will help keep your hands warm if your office is freezing!

Finished Measurement: One size approximately 7 " around when flat. Wrister will stretch to fit most women.


## Materials:

- Red Heart ${ }^{\oplus}$ With Love ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ : 1 skein 1816 Waterlily.
- Knitting Needles: 5.5mm [US 9].
- Yarn needle.

GAUGE: 24 sts = 4"; 22 rows = 4" in ribbing. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needle to obtain the gauge.

## RIGHT WRISTER

Cast on 38 sts. Knit 1 row. Work in ribbing as follows:
Row 1 (Right Side): K2, * p2, k2; repeat from * across.
Row 2: P2, * k2, p2; repeat from * across. Repeat Rows 1 and 2 for ribbing until piece measures 2" end Row 2.
Divide for Thumb (Right Side): Keeping continuity of ribbing, work across first 26 sts, bind off next 2 sts, work to end.
Next Row: Work to bind-off, cast on 2 sts, work to end.
Work even in ribbing until piece measures $8^{\prime \prime}$ or desired length. Bind off all sts in ribbing loosely.

## LEFT WRISTER

Work same as for Right Wrister EXCEPT work Divide For Thumb Row as follows: K10, bind off 2 sts, work to end.
Finishing
Sew seams. Weave in ends.

## Beginner Mittens for All

Designed by Nancy Anderson

Fine tune your crochet skills with these Beginner Mittens for All! If you've ever wondered how to crochet mittens, these patterns from Red Heart Yarn will make you a pro in no time! This set is great for your family or give them to your neighbor for the holidays! With these instructions, you can make three pairs of mittens, one men's set, one woman's set, and one set for a child.

Directions are for Child's size $4 / 5$ yrs. Changes for sizes Women's and Men's are in parentheses. Child size measures 6 " around $x$ $71 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ long. Women's size measures $71 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ around $x$ $111 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ long. Men's size measures $91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ around $x$ 12" long.


## Materials:

- Child's Version - RED HEART ${ }^{\oplus}$ "Super Saver ${ }^{\circledR \prime}$ : 1 skein each 387 Soft Navy B and 984 Shaded Dusk C.
- Women's Version - RED HEART ${ }^{\oplus}$ "Super Saver ${ }^{\oplus \prime \prime}$ : 1 skein each 624 Tea Leaf A and 387 Soft Navy B.
- Men's Version - RED HEART® "Super Saver®": 1 skein 624 Tea Leaf A.
- Crochet Hook: 5.5mm [US I-9].
- Stitch markers
- Yarn needle.

GAUGE: $16 \mathrm{sc}=4$ " ${ }^{\prime \prime} 17$ rows $=4 "$. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

## Special Abbreviation

Sc2tog = [insert hook in next st, yo, draw yarn through st] twice, yo, draw yarn through all 3 loops on hook.

## NOTES

These simple mittens are designed without a definite left or right hand and are worked in joined rounds.
Cuffs are done in ribbed stitch rows by working sc in the back loops only. They are extra long for added warmth or can be folded at the wrist.
Men's mittens are worked in a solid color, Child's and Women's in stripe patterns as follows:
Work in 2 row stripes for Child's mittens, ending with 5 rounds of $\mathbf{C}$ at fingertips.
Work in 1 row stripes for Women's mittens, ending with 7 rounds of $\mathbf{A}$ at fingertips.

## MITTENS

Cuff
Using C (B, A), ch 15 (21, 24).
Row 1: Working in back loops only, sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across, ch 1, turn.
Repeat Row 1 for a total of $18(22,24)$ rows.
Fold cuff in half and join ends with slip st to form cuff. Do not fasten off.

## Hand

Round 1: Working along row ends on cuff, slip st evenly around for $18(22,26)$ sts, join round with slip st.

Round 2: Ch 1, place marker, [sc in next 8 (10, 12) sts, 2 sc in next st] twice. Join with slip st [20 $(24,28) \mathrm{sts}]$.
Round 3: Ch 1, [sc in next $9(11,13)$ sts, 2 sc in next st] twice. Join with slip st [22 $(26,30) \mathrm{sts}]$. Round 4: Ch 1, [sc in next $10(12,14)$ sts, 2 sc in next st] twice. Join with slip st $[24(28,32)$ sts].
Child's size: Proceed to next step.
Women's size: Ch 1, [sc in next 13 sts, 2 sc in next st] twice. Join with slip st ( 30 sts ).
Men's size: Ch 1, [sc in next 15 sts, 2 sc in next st] twice.
Join with slip st (34 sts).
Repeat as established, working 1 more sc before increasing each round, for 2 more rounds (38 sts).
Next Step: Continuing with stripe/solid pattern as set, ch 1, sc in each sc around, join with slip st. Repeat for a total of $1(3,3)$ rounds.
Thumb Opening
Next round: Ch 1, [sc in next $20(26,32)$ sts, ch 4 $(5,6)$, skip remaining sts and join with slip st to first st.

## Upper Hand

Sc in each st around for $8(10,12)$ rounds [24 $(31$, 38) sts], decreasing 1 st on last round for Women's size only [24 $(30,38)$ sts].
Round 1: [Sc $10(13,17)$, sc2tog] twice [22 (28, 36) sts].

Round 2: [Sc $9(12,16)$, sc2tog] twice [20 $(26,34)$ sts].
Round 3: [Sc $8(11,15)$, sc2tog] twice [18 $(24,32)$ sts].
Round 4: [Sc $7(10,14)$, sc2tog] twice [16 $(22,30)$ sts].
Child's size only: Sc2tog around (8 sts), fasten
off.
Continue with thumb.
Round 5: Sc in each st around.
Round 6: [Sc 9 (13), sc2tog] twice [20 (28) sts].
Next 2 rounds: Sc2tog around [5 (7) sts]. Fasten
off at end of last round.

## Thumb

Round 1: Join yarn to thumb opening at st closest to upper hand, ch 1, sc in each st around, joining with slip st $[8(9,12)$ sts]. Sc in each st around for $4(7,8)$ rounds.

Next round: Sc2tog, sc to 3 sts from last st, sc last 2 sts tog $[6(7,10)$ sts]. Sc2tog around, working last st as sc on Women's size [3 $(4,5)$ sts]. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

With some fun yarn colors, you can knit Mittens for the Whole Family! This collection of handmade mittens from Red Heart Yarn makes a pair for dad, mom, and a little one! This set would be a great gift for a new family or a fun craft to do when the nights are cold!

Mittens Sized for Children (Women, Men). Directions are for smallest size; changes for larger sizes are in parentheses.
Hand Circumference: $51 / 2(73 / 4,91 / 2)^{\prime \prime}$
Length from wrist to fingertips: $6(101 / 2,12)^{\prime \prime}$


## Materials:

- RED HEART ${ }^{\oplus}$ "Super Saver®": 1 skein each 624 Tea Leaf A, 964 Primary B, and 319 Cherry Red C.
- Double Pointed Knitting Needles: 3.5 mm [US 4] and 3.75 mm [US 5].
- Stitch markers (3)
- Small stitch holder
- Yarn needle.

GAUGE: 18 sts = 4"; 28 Rounds = 4" in Stockinette stitch.

CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needle to obtain the gauge.

## Special Abbreviation

M1 (make one stitch) = Lift running thread before next stitch onto left needle and knit into the back loop.
Stripe Sequence
Children's Version: * 3 Rounds B, 2 Rounds A; repeat from *.
Women's Version: * 3 Rounds A, 2 Rounds C; repeat from *.

## MITTENS (make 2)

## Cuff Ribbing

With smaller needles and A (C, C), cast on 24 (36, 44) sts.

Divide evenly among 3 dpns, place marker for beginning of round and join being careful not to twist sts.
Round 1: * K2, p2; repeat from * around .
Repeat Round 1 for $13 / 4(3,31 / 2)^{\prime \prime}$.

## Begin Pattern

Change to larger needles, begin St st, and k1 (1, 0) round even.

For children's and women's sizes only
Join B (A), and begin Stripe sequence.
For all sizes
Work even until piece measures $21 / 4(41 / 2,5)$ " from beginning.
Thumb Gusset
Round 1: K11 (17, 21), place marker, k1, M1, k1, place marker, $k$ to end-25 $(37,45)$ sts.
Round 2 and all even rounds: Knit even.
Round 3: K11 (17, 21), M1, k3, M1, k to end-27 $(39,47)$ sts.
Round 5: K11 (17, 21), M1, k5, M1, k to end-29 $(41,49)$ sts.
Round 7: K11 (17, 21), M1, k7, M1, k to end-31 $(43,51)$ sts.
For women's and men's sizes only
Round 9: K17 (21), M1, k9, M1, k to end-45 (53) sts.
Round 11: K17 (21), M1, k11, M1, k to end-47 (55) sts.

Round 13: K17 (21), M1, k13, M1, k to end-49 (57) sts.

## For men's size only

Round 15: K21, M1, k15, M1, k to end-59 sts. For all sizes
Hand
Next Round: $\mathrm{K} 11(17,21)$, place next $9(15,17)$
sts on holder for thumb, cast on $2(1,0)$ sts, $k$ to
end-24 $(35,42)$ sts. Work even in pattern as
established until piece measures 5 ( $9101 / 2$ )" from beginning.

## For children's and women's sizes only

End with round 3 of $\mathbf{B}(\mathbf{A})$, and continue in $\mathbf{A}(\mathbf{C})$ only.

## For all sizes

Shape Mitten Top
Round 1 and all odd rounds: Knit even.
Round 2: * K4 (5, 5), k2tog; repeat from * around-20 $(30,36)$ sts.
Round 4: * K3 (4, 4), k2tog; repeat from * around-16 $(25,30)$ sts.
Round 6: * K2 $(3,3)$, k2tog; repeat from * around-12 $(20,24)$ sts.
For children's size only
Round 7: * K1, k2tog; repeat from * around-8
sts.
Round 8: * K2tog; repeat from * around-4 sts.
For women's and men's sizes only
Round 8: * K2, k2tog; repeat from * around-15 (18) sts.

Round 10: * K1, k2tog; repeat from * around-10 (12) sts.

Round 12: * K2tog; repeat from * around-5 (6) sts.
For all sizes
Cut yarn, leaving a $6^{\prime \prime}$ tail. Thread through remaining sts, pull tightly to secure.
Thumb
Divide $9(15,17)$ sts from holder onto 3 dpns. Continue in pattern as established and work 1 round even, picking up 1 st between hand and thumb at end of row-10 $(16,18)$ sts. Work even until thumb measures $3 / 4(11 / 2,13 / 4)^{\prime \prime}$.
For children's size only
Round 1: K1, k2tog, k2, k2tog, k1, k2tog-7 sts.
Round 2: Knit even.
Round 3: K2tog, k1, k2tog, k2tog-4sts.
For women's size only

Round 1: * K2, k2tog; repeat from * around-12 sts.
Rounds 2 and 4: Knit even.
Round 3: * K1, k2tog; repeat from * around-8 sts.
Round 5: * K2tog; repeat from * around-4 sts. For men's size only
Round 1: [K2, k2tog, k1, k2tog] 2 times, k2, k2tog-13 sts.
Rounds 2 and 4: Knit even.
Round 3: [K1, k2tog, k2tog] 2 times, k1, k2tog-8 sts.
Round 5: * K2tog; repeat from * around-4 sts. For all sizes
Cut yarn leaving a $6^{\prime \prime}$ tail. Thread through remaining sts, pull tightly to secure.
FINISHING
Weave in yarn ends.


## Lettuce Green Arm Warmers

These pretty Lettuce Green Arm Warmers from Red Heart Yarn are not only functional, they're fashionable! Knitted arm warmers are making a comeback and these feminine warmers would look great on anyone!

Directions are for size Small/Medium; changes for size Large/XLarge, are in parentheses.


## Materials:

- STITCH NATION by Debbie Stoller ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ "Full $o^{\prime}$ Sheep ${ }^{\text {TM" }}$ : 1 (2) balls 2630 Meadow.
- Knitting Needles: 4.5 mm [US 7].
- Place markers (2)
- Small stitch holder
- Yarn needle.

GAUGE: 19 sts = 4"; 26 Rows = 4" in St st. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needle to obtain the gauge.

## Special Abbreviations

M1 (make one stitch) = Lift running thread before next stitch onto left needle and knit into the back loop.
K1, p1 Rib (worked over an odd number of sts)
Row 1 (Right Side): K1, * p1, k1; repeat from * across row.
Row 2: P1, * k1, p1; repeat from * across row. Repeat Rows 1 and 2 for K1, p1 rib.

## ARM WARMERS

## Right Arm

Cast on 41 (45) sts.
Cuff
Begin with Row 1, work in K1, p1 rib until piece measures $11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, end by working a wrong side row. Begin Pattern
Row 1: P3 (4), k13, p7 (8), k1, p17 (19).
Row 2: K 17 (19), p1, k7 (8), p13, k3 (4).
Row 3: P3 (4), k4tog, [yo, k1] 5 times, yo, k4togtbl, p7 (8), k1, p17 (19).
Row 4: Repeat Row 2.
Repeat Rows 1-4 until piece measures $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ from beginning, then work Rows 1 and 2 once more.
Shape Thumb
Row 3: P3 (4), k4tog, [yo, k1] 5 times, yo, k4togtbl, p7 (8), place marker, M1, k1, M1, place marker, p17 (19)-43 (47) sts.
Row 4: K17 (19), p3, k7 (8), p13, k3 (4).
Keeping continuity of pattern, continue to inc 1 st after first marker and before second marker every right side row 5 (6) times more, working extra sts into pattern-53 (59) sts; 13 (15) sts between markers.
Next Row (Wrong Side): Work across row to within 1 st of first marker, slip st to right needle, remove marker and place next 13
(15) sts on holder for thumb, remove second marker, k1, psso, work to end of row-39 (43) sts. Keeping in pattern, work even for $11 / 2$ ", end by working a wrong side row.
Top Opening
Work 2 rows in K1, p1 rib. Bind off in pattern.
Shape Thumb Opening
Slip 13 (15) sts from holder to needle.

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Join yarn to wrong side, and work 2 rows in K1, p1 rib inc 1 st at beginning of each row-15 (17)
sts.
Bind off loosely in pattern.

## Left Arm

Cast on and work cuff same as for Right Arm.
Begin Pattern
Row 1: P17 (19), k1, p7 (8), k13, p3 (4).
Row 2: K3 (4), p13, k7 (8), p1, k17 (19).
Row 3: P17 (19), k1, p7 (8), k4tog, [yo, k1] 5
times, yo, k4tog-tbl, p3 (4).
Row 4: Repeat Row 2.
Repeat Rows 1-4 until piece measures $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ from beginning, then work Rows 1 and 2 once more.
Shape Thumb
Row 3: P17 (19), place marker, M1, k1, M1, place marker, p7 (8), k4tog, [yo, k1] 5 times, yo, k4togtbl, p3 (4)-43 (47) sts.
Row 4: K3 (4), p13, k7 (8), p3, k17 (19).
Keeping continuity of pattern, continue to inc 1 st after first marker and before second marker every right side row 5 (6) times
more-53 (59) sts; 13 (15) sts between markers.
Complete same as for Right Arm.

## FINISHING

Sew thumb and side seams. Weave in yarn ends.

## Colorful Texting Gloves

Designed by Sara Delaney.

These Colorful Texting Gloves from Red Heart Yarn make operating your phone or MP3 player easy during the cold winter months. These thin gloves make great gifts for teens or women who are on the go.

One size fits most.


## Materials:

- Red Heart ${ }^{®}$ "Heart \& Sole ${ }^{\text {TM" }}: 2$ balls 3931 Berry Bliss.
- Crochet Hook: 3.25mm [US D-4].
- Stitch markers
- Four $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ buttons
- Yarn needle.

GAUGE: 18 sts = 4"; 16 rows = 4" in pattern. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.
Note: Index fingers and thumbs flip back and are buttoned open while using phone.

## SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS:

Fsc (foundation single crochet) = First St: Ch 2, insert hook under top 2 strands of first ch, yo, draw up a loop, yo, draw through 1 loop, yo, draw through both loops (first fsc complete). Remaining sts: Insert hook under both loops of previous st, yo, draw up a loop, yo, draw through 1 loop, yo, draw through both loops. Esc (extended single crochet) = Insert hook into the next st, yo and draw up a loop, yo and draw through 1 loop, yo and draw through both loops. Esc2tog (extended single crochet two together) = Insert hook under front loop only of next 2 sts, yo and draw a loop through both sts, yo and draw through 1 loop, yo and draw through both loops.
Fpsc (front post single crochet) = Yo and insert hook from front to back and to front again around the vertical post of indicated st, Yarnover and draw up a loop. (There are now 3 loops on your hook.) Yarn-over and draw through 2 loops on your hook. (There will be 2 loops left on the hook.) Yarn-over and draw through the last 2 loops on your hook.
Bpsc (back post single crochet) $=$ Yo and insert hook from back to front and to back again around the vertical post of indicated st, Yarnover and draw up a loop. (There are now 3 loops on your hook.) Yarn-over and draw through 2 loops on your hook. (There will be 2 loops left on the hook.) Yarn-over and draw through the last 2 loops on your hook.

## GLOVE

## Hand

Foundation round: Fsc 30, join in a round with slip st.
Round 1: Ch 2, esc in each st around, join with slip st to the 2nd ch of ch-2

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Round 2: Ch 2, fpsc in first st, bpsc in 2nd st, *fpsc in next st, bpsc in next st; repeat from * around, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2.
Rounds 3 \& 4: Repeat Round 2.
Round 5: Ch 2, esc in each st around, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2 ( 30 sts ).
Round 6: Ch 2, 2 esc in next st, esc in each st to last 2 sts, 2 esc in next st, esc in last st, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2 ( 32 sts ).
Round 7: Repeat Round 5.
Round 8: Repeat Round 6 ( 34 sts ).
Round 9: Repeat Round 5.
Round 10: Repeat Round 6 (36 sts).
Round 11: Repeat Round 5.
Round 12: Repeat Round 6 (38 sts).
Round 13: Repeat Round 5.
Round 14: Repeat Round 6 ( 40 sts ).
Round 15: Repeat Round 5.
Round 16: Repeat Round 6 (42 sts).
Rounds 17 \& 18: Repeat Round 5.
Round 19: Ch 2, esc in next 38 sts, esc into the post of the last esc made, place a marker in this st (counts as a ch-2) round complete.
Round 20: Skip the last 4 sts of the last round, esc into the 5th st of the round just finished (you just set aside sts for the thumb that will be worked later), esc in the next 33 sts, join the round with a slip st to the esc with the marker (34 sts).
Round 21: Ch 2, esc in each st around, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2 ( 34 sts ).
Rounds 22, 24, 26: Repeat Round 21.
Round 23: Ch 2, 2 esc in next st, esc in each st to last 2 sts, 2 esc in next st, esc in last st, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2 ( 36 sts).
Round 25: Ch 2, 2 esc in next st, esc in each st to last 2 sts, 2 esc in next st, esc in last st, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2 ( 38 sts ).
Round 27: Ch 2, esc in next 15 sts, skip 8 sts, esc in last 15 sts, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch2 (you just set aside the sts for the pinkie that will be worked later) ( 30 sts).
Round 28: Ch 2, esc in next 10 sts, skip 10 sts, esc in last 10 sts, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2 (you just set aside the sts for the ring finger that will be worked later) ( 20 sts).

Round 29: Ch 2, esc in next 5 sts, [esc into the post of the last st] twice, skip 10 sts, esc in last 5 sts, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2 (you just set aside the sts for the middle finger that will be worked later) ( 12 sts).

## Index Finger

Round 30: Ch 2, esc in each st around, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2 (12 sts).
Rounds 31-37: Repeat Round 30.

## FOR THE RIGHT HAND

Round 38: Ch 2, esc in next 6 sts, esc through the back loop only of next 6 sts (across back of hand), join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2 (12 sts).

## FOR THE LEFT HAND

Round 38: Ch 2, esc through the back loop only of next 6 sts (across back of hand), esc in next 6 sts, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2 (12 sts).

## FOR BOTH HANDS

Round 39: Ch 2, esc in each st around, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2, fasten off and weave in ends.

## Fingertip

Round 1: Join yarn to front loop of the first esc that was worked through the back loop only in Round 38, ch 2 and esc through the same front loop, esc through the front loop only of the next 5 sts, [work esc in the post of the last st] 6 times, being careful not to twist, join with slip st to the $2^{\text {nd }}$ ch of ch-2 (12 sts).
Rounds 2, 3, 4: Ch 2, esc in each st around, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2 (12 sts).
Round 5: Ch 2, [esc2tog] 6 times, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2, ch 4, slip st in joined st (this creates button loop). Fasten off, weave tail through the top of all sts and tighten to close, weave in ends.

## Middle Finger

Round 1: Join yarn between 2 sts at the base of the index finger facing the middle finger, ch 2 , esc in the 5th st of Round 28 (same as the base of the index finger), esc in next 10 sts, esc in the 15th st of Round 28 (again, same as the base of the index finger), join with slip st to the 2nd ch of ch-2 (12 sts).
Rounds 2-13: Ch 2, esc in each st around, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2 (12 sts).
Round 14: Ch 2, [esc2tog] 6 times, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2. Fasten off, weave tail through the top of all sts and tighten to close, weave in ends.

## Ring Finger

Round 1: Join yarn through the posts of both sts at the base of the middle finger, facing the ring finger, ch 2 , esc in the 10th st of Round 27 (same as the base of the middle finger), esc in next 10 sts, esc in the 21st st of Round 27 (again, same as the base of the middle finger), join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2 (12 sts).
Rounds 2-12: Ch 2, esc in each st around, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2 ( 12 sts).
Round 13: Ch 2, [esc2tog] 6 times, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2. Fasten off, weave tail through the top of all sts and tighten to close, weave in ends.

## Pinkie

Round 1: Join yarn through the posts of both sts at the base of the ring finger, facing the pinkie finger, ch 2 , esc in the 15 th st of Round 26 (same as the base of the ring finger), esc in next 8 sts, esc in the 24th st of Round 26 (again, same as the base of the ring finger), join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2 ( 10 sts ).
Rounds 2-8: Ch 2, esc in each st around, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2 (10 sts).
Round 9: Ch 2, [esc2tog] 5 times, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2. Fasten off, weave tail through the top of all sts and tighten to close, weave in ends.
There may be small gaps at the base of the fingers; use yarn tails to weave closed.

## Thumb

Round 1: This round of the thumb was begun in Round 20 of the hand (ch 2 and 4 esc already exist). Join yarn to the 5th st of Round 20, ch 2 (this counts as an esc), 2 esc in the 38th st of Round 19, esc in the next 3 sts, 2 esc in last st, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2 (12 sts).
Rounds 2-6: Ch 2, esc in each st around, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2 (12 sts).

## FOR THE RIGHT HAND

Round 7: Ch 2, esc in next 6 sts, esc through the back loop only of next 6 sts, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2 (12 sts).

## FOR THE LEFT HAND

Round 7: Ch 2, esc through the back loop only of next 6 sts, esc in next 6 sts, join with slip st to the 2nd ch of ch-2 (12 sts).

## FOR BOTH HANDS

Round 8: Ch 2, esc in each st around, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2, fasten off and weave in ends.

## Thumb Tip

Round 1: Join yarn to the front loop of the first esc that was worked through the back loop only in Round 7, ch 2 and esc through the same front loop, esc through the front loop only of the next 5 sts, [work esc in the post of the last st] 6 times, being careful not to twist, join with slip st to the 2nd ch of ch-2 (12 sts).
Rounds 2-4: Ch 2, esc in each st around, join with slip st to the 2 nd ch of ch-2 (12 sts).
Round 5: Ch 2, [esc2tog] 6 times, join with slip st to the 2nd ch of ch-2, ch 4, slip st in joined st (buttonhole made).
Fasten off, weave tail through the top of all sts and tighten to close. Weave in ends.

## FINISHING

Lay the index finger and thumb tips back against hand and mark the st that lies underneath the buttonhole loop at the tip; sew buttons at these points.

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## Socks \& Slippers for the Family

## Lacy Knee High Socks

Designed by Kathy Sasser.
These Lacy Knee High Socks from Red Heart Yarn are so comfy on your feet! Curl up with a good book and put on these handmade socks when the weather takes a nasty turn and you'll be nothing but happy and cozy.

Directions are for size Woman's Small Shoe (68); changes for sizes Medium ( $81 / 2-10$ ) and Large ( $101 / 2-12$ ) are in parentheses.


## Materials:

- RED HEART ${ }^{\oplus}$ "Heart \& Sole ${ }^{\circledR}$ with Aloe": 3 Balls 3945 Rustica.
- Double Pointed Knitting Needles: One set each 2.25 mm [US 1], 3.25 mm [US 3], 4 mm [US 6] and 4.5 mm [US 7].
- Stitch markers
- Stitch holders
- Yarn needle

GAUGE: 28 sts = 4"; 36 rows = 4" in St st on 3.25 mm [US 3] needles. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needles to obtain the gauge.

## SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

ssk = slip next two stitches knitwise to right needle, insert point of left needle through front of sts, knit these sts together through back loop.

## Short Rows

W\&T: Bring yarn to front, slip next st, turn, wrap yarn around slip st and slip same st back onto right-hand needle. On next row, work wrapped st by picking up wrap and working together with st on left-hand needle.
Grafting: Place sts to be grafted onto 2 needles with wrong sides together and with needle points facing to the right. Using yarn needle, insert into first st on front needle as if to purl, leaving st on needle. Insert into first st on back needle as if to knit, leaving st on needle. *Insert into first st
on front needle as if to knit, slipping st off needle, then into next st on front needle as if to purl, leaving st on needle.
Insert into first st on back needle as if to purl, slipping st off needle, then into next st as if to knit, leaving st on needle.
Repeat from * until all sts have been grafted.

## PATTERN STITCH

Lace Stitch (multiple of 3 sts)
Round 1: Knit.
Round 2: K2, *k2tog, yo, k1; repeat from * to last st, k1.
Round 3: Knit.
Round 4: K2, *yo, k1, k2tog; repeat from * to last st, k1.
Repeat Rounds 1-4 for Lace st.

## KNEE HIGH (Make 2)

Leg
With 2.25 mm [US 1] needles, loosely cast on 78 $(84,86)$ sts. Divide sts evenly around doublepointed needles, taking care not to twist sts. Place marker for beginning for round.

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Work in K1, p1 rib 15 rounds, decreasing 18 (21, $23)$ sts evenly spaced on last round - $60(63,63)$ sts.
Change to 4.5 mm [US 7] needles and beginning with Round 1, work in Lace st for 5 rounds.

## Shape Calf

Decrease Round: K1, k2tog, work in pattern to last 2 sts, ssk - $58(61,61)$ sts.
Continue to work in Lace st, repeating Decrease
Round every 6th round 4 more times, then every
7 th round $2(3,2)$ times $-46(47,49)$ sts.
Work even until piece measures $13^{\prime \prime}$ from beginning, end with even number round. Cut yarn.

## Shape Heel Flap

With right side facing, slip last $13(13,12)$ sts and first $12(13,13)$ sts to one 3.25 mm [US 3] needle for Heel Flap, removing marker, slip next 21 (21, 24) sts to a stitch holders for Instep.

Join yarn and using 3.25 mm [US 3] needles, knit across $25(26,25)$ sts.
Increase Row (WS): Slip 1, purl across, increasing $3(4,5)$ sts evenly spaced across - $28(30,30)$ sts.
Row 1: [Slip 1, k1] across.
Row 2: Slip 1, purl across.
Repeat last 2 rows until 28 rows have been worked.
Turn Heel
Short Rows
Row 1 (RS): K16 (17, 17), ssk, k1, W\&T.
Row 2: Slip 1, p5, p2tog, p1, W\&T.
Row 3: Slip 1, k6, ssk, k1, W\&T.
Row 4: Slip 1, p7, p2tog, p1, W\&T.
Row 5: Slip 1, k8, ssk, k1, W\&T.
Row 6: Slip 1, p9, p2tog, p1, W\&T.
Row 7: Slip 1, k10, ssk, k1, W\&T.
Row 8: Slip 1, p11, p2tog, p1, W\&T.
Row 9: Slip 1, k12, ssk, k1, W\&T.
Row 10: Slip1, p13, p2tog, p1, W\&T.
Row 11: Slip 1, k14, ssk, k0 (1, 1), W\&T.
Row 12: Slip 1, p14 (15, 15), p2tog, p0 (1, 1), turn - $16(18,18)$ sts.

## Sizes Medium And Large Only

Row 13: Slip 1, k15, k2tog, turn.
Row 14: Slip 1, p14, p2tog, turn-16 sts.
Shape Gusset

Next Round: With right side facing and 3.25 mm [US 3] needles, knit 16 sts from Heel Flap, pick up and knit 14 sts along side edge of Heel Flap, place marker for Gusset, using 4mm [US 6] needles, work across $21(21,24)$ sts from Instep stitch holders, place marker for Gusset, using 3.25 mm [US 3] needles, pick up and knit 14 sts along opposite edge of Heel Flap, knit first 8 sts and place marker for beginning of round - $65(65,68)$ sts.
Keep needles as established with Heel sts worked in St st on 3.25 mm [US 3] needles and Instep sts worked in Lace st on 4mm [US 6] needles.
Decrease Round: Work to 3 sts before first Gusset marker k2tog, k1, work to next Gusset marker, k1, ssk, work to end of round - 63 (63, 66) sts.

Repeat Decrease Round every other round 7 (6, $6)$ more times - $49(51,54)$ sts.

## Shape Foot

Work until Foot measures 7½ (8, 9)" from Heel.

## Shape Toe

Next Round: With 3.25 mm [US 3] needles, k14 $(15,15)$ sts, place marker for Toe, continuing with same size needle, knit across next 21 (21, $24)$ sts, increasing $7(9,6)$ sts evenly spaced across, place marker for Toe, k14 (15, 15) sts - $56(60,60)$ sts.

Decrease Round: Knit to 3 sts before first Toe marker, k2tog, k2, ssk, knit to 3 sts before next marker, k2tog, k2, ssk, work to end round - 52 $(56,56)$ sts.
Working in St st on all sts, repeat Decrease
Round every other round $4(5,5)$ more times 36 sts.
Then repeat Decrease Round every round $5(4,4)$ times $-16(20,20)$ sts.
Divide sts in half on 2 needles and graft sts together.
FINISHING
Weave in ends.

## Fuzzy Baby Booties Crochet Pattern

## Designed by Linda Cyr

Crochet a pair of fuzzy baby booties to keep baby's little feet warm and cozy. Baby will love the texture. These are quick and easy crochet baby booties from Red Heart Yarn, so why not make a few sets?

Boots should fit most babies 6-12 months. Foot Length: 4".


Materials:

- RED HEART ${ }^{\oplus}$ "Baby Clouds ${ }^{\top \pi}$ ": 1 ball 9925 Playtime Multi.
- Crochet Hook: 8 mm [US L-11].
- Yarn needle.

GAUGE: 9 sts = $4^{\prime \prime}$ in sc. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the specified gauge. Special Abbreviation
hdc2tog (hdc dec): [Yarn over, insert hook into st and draw up a loop] twice, yarn over, draw through all 5 loops on hook.

## BOOTIE (make 2)

## Ch 8.

Round 1: Work 2 dc in 3rd ch from hook, (beginning ch counts as first dc) dc in next $4 \mathrm{ch}, 6$ dc in last ch, turn to work along opposite side of beginning ch, dc in next $4 \mathrm{ch}, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in last ch, slip st in top of beginning ch to join-20 dc.
Round 2: Ch 1, sc in back loops only in each st around, slip st in beginning ch to join.
Round 3: Ch 1, sc in next 6 sts, [hdc2tog] 4 times, sc in next 6 sts, slip st in beginning ch to join - 16 sts.
Round 4: Ch 1, sc in next 6 sts, [hdc2tog] 2 times, sc in next 6 sts, slip st in beginning ch to join - 14 sts.
Rounds 5-7: Ch 1, sc in each st around, slip st in beginning ch to join.
Round 8: Ch 1, slip st in each st around, slip st to beginning ch to join.
Fasten off.
FINISHING
Weave in ends.

## Traditional Knitted Socks

Designed by Lorna Miser

Traditional Knitted Socks are not only a fun winter project, but they make a great gift for everyone! These handmade socks from Red Heart Yarn can be made to fit small to large feet and are great for both men and women. You'll never have to buy socks again with this easy knitted pattern!

Directions are for size Small (Women's 5½-7); changes for sizes Medium (Women's $7 ½-9$ or Men's 6-8), Large (Women's 9½-12 or Men's $81 / 2-11$ ) and X-Large (Men's $111 / 2-141 / 2$ ) are in parentheses. Finished Measurements Ankle: 8 (9, 9½, 10½)".
Foot Length: $7112(81 / 2,9112,101 / 2)^{\prime \prime}$.


## Materials:

- STITCH NATION by Debbie Stoller ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ "Bamboo Ewe ${ }^{\text {TM" }}: 2(2,2,3)$ balls 5410 Mercury.
- Double Pointed Needles: One set 3.5 mm (US 4).
- Stitch holder
- Stitch markers
- Yarn needle.

GAUGE: 20 sts $=4^{\prime \prime} ; 28$ rows $=4^{\prime \prime}$ in K2, p2, slightly stretched.
CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needles to obtain the gauge.

## Special Abbreviations

ssk: slip next two stitches knitwise to right needle, insert point of left needle through front of sts, knit these sts together through back loop.

## Special Techniques <br> Grafting

Thread yarn needle with long length of yarn. Hold the two needles in the left hand with wrong sides together. Keeping the yarn needle and yarn under the points of the knitting needles, graft the stitches together as follows:
*1. Insert yarn needle through first st of front needle as if to knit and slip the st off.
2. Insert needle through 2 nd st of front needle as if to purl, but leave the st on the needle.
3. Insert yarn through first st on back needle as if to purl and slip the st off.
4. Insert yarn through 2nd stitch on back needle as if to knit, but leave st on needle. Repeat from * until all the sts are joined. Take care to draw yarn up so that gauge of grafting equals gauge of knitting. Fasten off. Weave in ends on wrong side.

## SOCKS

Leg
Cast on $40(44,48,52)$ sts. Divide sts evenly around double pointed needles. Join to work in rounds, taking care not to twist sts. Place marker for beginning of round.
Work in K2, p2 rib until piece measures $8^{\prime \prime}$ from beg. Knit first st to center K2, p2 rib on Instep.

Heel Flap
Note : Heel Flap is worked back and forth in rows.
Row 1: Turn, slip 1, purl across 19 (21, 23, 25), leave remaining sts unworked for Instep - 20 $(22,24,26)$ sts.
Row 2: [Slip 1, k1] across.
Repeat Rows 1-2 for 20 (22, 24, 26) rows.
Turn Heel
Row 1 (Right Side): Slip 1, k11 (12, 13, 14), ssk, k1, turn.
Row 2: Slip 1, p5, p2tog, p1, turn.
Row 3: Slip 1, k6, ssk, k1, turn.
Row 4: Slip 1, p7, p2tog, p1, turn.
Row 5: Slip 1, k8, ssk, k1, turn.
Row 6: Slip 1, p9, p2tog, p1, turn.

## For Small Only

Row 7: Slip 1, k10, ssk, turn.
Row 8: Slip 1, p10, p2tog, turn - 12 sts.
Sizes Medium, Large and X-Large
Row 7: Slip 1, k10, ssk, k1, turn.
Row 8: Slip 1, p11, p2tog, p1, turn - $(14,16,18)$
sts.
For Large Only
Row 9: Slip 1, k12, ssk, turn.
Row 10: Slip 1, p12, p2tog, turn - 14 sts.
For X-Large Only
Row 9: Slip 1, k12, ssk, k1, turn.
Row 10: Slip 1, p13, p2tog, p1, turn - 16 sts.

## Gusset

With right side facing, knit across $6(7,7,8)$ sts of Heel, place marker for beginning of round, knit across remaining $6(7,7,8)$
sts of Heel, pick up and knit $10(11,12,13)$ sts along side of Heel Flap, place marker for Gusset shaping, work in K2, p2 rib as established across $20(22,24,26)$ Instep sts, place marker for Gusset shaping, pick up and knit $10(11,12,13)$ sts along side of
Heel - $52(58,62,68)$ sts.
Round 1: Knit to 3 sts before first Gusset marker, k2tog, k1, work in rib across Instep sts to next Gusset marker, k1, ssk, knit to end of round - 50 $(56,60,66)$ sts.
Round 2: Knit to Gusset marker, work in rib across Instep sts to next Gusset marker, knit to end of round.

Repeat Rounds 1-2 for $5(6,6,7)$ times - $40(44$, 48,52 ) sts on last round.
Keeping Instep sts in rib and sole sts in St st, work until Foot measures $71 / 2(81 / 2,91 / 2,101 / 2)^{\prime \prime}$ or $11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ shorter than desired length.

## Shape Toe

Decrease Round: [Knit to 3 sts before Gusset marker, k2tog, k2, ssk] twice - 36 (40, 44, 48) sts. Repeat Decrease Round $5(6,7,8)$ times -16 sts. Divide sts in half and graft together.


## Fireside Slippers

Designed by Kim Kotary
Cozy up with a mug of hot cocoa and keep your toes warm in these Fireside Slippers from Red Heart Yarn. Anyone can crochet slippers, and this is a great beginner pattern to help you get started. Soon you'll be making warm winter slippers for the whole family!

## Directions are for size Small. Changes for sizes Medium and Large are in parentheses.



## Materials:

- RED HEART ${ }^{\text {© "Super Saver }}{ }^{\oplus} ": 1$ skein 319 Cherry Red.
- Crochet Hook: 5.5mm [US I-9]
- Yarn needle

GAUGE: $9 \mathrm{dc}=4 \prime$; and 6 rows $=4 \prime$ ". CHECK YOUR
GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge given.
NOTE: Leave long tails at the beginning and end of each piece to use for finishing.

## SLIPPERS (make 2)

First Side and Sole
Row 1: Ch $23(25,27)$ dc in 4th ch from hook and in each ch across, turn-21 $(23,25)$ sts.
Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout), dc across, turn-21 $(23,25)$ sts.
Rows 3-8: Rep Row 2.

## Instep

Row 9-12: Ch 3, dc in next $8(10,12)$ sts, turn - 9 $(11,13)$ sts.
Row 13: Ch 3, dc across in each dc across, ch 14, turn.

## Second Side and Sole

Row 14: Dc in 4th ch from hook and in each st across, turn-21 $(23,25)$ sts.
Row 15-21: Repeat Row 2. Fasten off at the end of Row 21.

## Finishing

Place instep on top of foot and wrap sides around foot, overlapping sole layers. Pin layers together. Sew each side of sole to sides of slipper. Gather stitches at toe. Sew heal seam. With RS facing, join yarn at top of heal seam, sc in each st around opening, working 2 sc into the ends of
the rows across instep, join with slip st in to first sc.
Make loop: Ch 10, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. Fasten off. Sew end of loop to top of heel seam and weave in ends.
Flower (make 2)
Ch 18, [dc, ch 3, slip st, (ch 3, dc, ch 3, slip st) 2 times] in 4th ch from hook, [slip st, ch 3, dc, ch 3, slip st] in each remaining ch-17 petals.
Starting with the first 3 petals, spiral the petals around in 3 layers. Tack the layers together and sew to instep of slipper.

## Holiday Vest for Baby

## Designed by Heather Lodinsky

Use this intermediate knitting pattern to create an adorable holiday vest for the smallest family member. This baby vest knitting pattern from Red Heart Yarn is full of color, but you do not have to switch yarns. Check out the matching holiday socks pattern shown in this picture.

Vest Sizes: $6(12,18,24)$ months
Finished Chest: 20 (22, 24½, 27)"
Length: 10 (11, 12, 13)"
Sock Sizes: S (M, L)
Finished Foot Length: $31 / 2(4,41 / 2)^{\prime \prime}$


## Materials:

- RED HEART ${ }^{\circledR}$ "Heart and Sole ${ }^{\circledR "}: 2(3,3$, 4) skeins 3973 Christmas.
- Knitting Needles: Vest -3.25 mm [US 3] straight and $16^{\prime \prime}$ circular and 3.5 mm [US 4] straight. Socks -3.25 mm
- [US 3] and 3.5mm [US 4] double pointed needles.
- Stitch holders
- Stitch markers
- Yarn needle.

GAUGE: 28 sts and 36 rows $=4^{\prime \prime}$ in St st on size US $4(3.5 \mathrm{~mm})$ needle. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needle to obtain the gauge given.
Special Abbreviation:
SSK (slip, slip, knit) = Slip next 2sts knitwise, one at a time, onto right needle; insert point of left needle into fronts of these 2 stitches and knit them together from this position.

## VEST

Back
With smaller needles, cast on $70(78,86,94)$ sts. Next row (WS): (P2, k2) across row, ending with p2.
Next row: (K2, p2) across row, ending with k2. Repeat last 2 rows for $3 / 4(3 / 4,1,1)^{\prime \prime}$, ending with a WS row.
Change to larger needles and work in St st until back measures $5(51 / 2,6,61 / 2)^{\prime \prime}$, ending with a WS row.
Shape Armhole: Bind off 6 sts at beginning of next 2 rows, 3 sts at beginning of next 2 rows, 2 sts at beginning of next 2 rows and 1 st at beginning of next 4 rows [44 $(52,60,68)$ sts]. Work even in St st until armhole measures $41 ⁄ 2(5,51 / 2,6)^{\prime \prime}$, ending with a WS row.
Shape Back Neck: K13 $(15,17,19)$ sts, slip center $18(22,26,30)$ sts on holder, attach another ball of yarn and knit remaining $13(15,17,19)$ sts. Working both sides at the same time, dec 1 st at each neck edge every row 3 times [10 $(12,14,16)$ sts]. Work even until armhole measures 5 ( $51 / 2,6,61 / 2$ )". Bind off.

## Front

With smaller needles, cast on $70(78,86,94)$ sts. Work same as for Back until 2 rows before armhole shaping.
Neck Shaping (RS): K34 (38, 42, 46), slip next 2 sts onto a holder or safety pin. Join second ball of yarn and knit remaining $34(38,42,46)$ sts. Working both sides at the same time, shape as Back for armholes AND AT THE SAME TIME dec 1 st at each neck edge every 3rd row $11(13,15,17)$ times $[10(12,14,16)$ sts]. Work even until piece measures same as Back to shoulders. Bind off.

## Finishing:

Sew shoulders seams.

## Knit armhole bands:

With smaller needles and RS facing, pick up 74 $(82,90,98)$ sts. Work p2, k2 rib as for bottom of vest for $3 / 4$ ". Bind off in rib.

## Neckband:

With smaller circular needle and RS facing, starting at right shoulder seam, pick up 4 sts down right back neck, knit across $18(22,26,30)$ sts on holder, pick up 4 sts up left back neck, 38 $(42,46,50)$ sts down left front neck, k2 sts at bottom of front neck, placing a marker between the two sts, then pick up $38(42,46,50)$ sts up right front neck edge [104 $(116,128,140)$ sts]. Place different color marker on needle to note beginning of round. Working in the round, work k2, p2 rib around entire neck.

## Next round:

Work in rib to 2 sts before marker at bottom of neck, k2tog, slip marker, ssk, work in rib to end of round.

## Next round:

Work in rib. Repeat the last 2 rounds until neck band measures $3 / 4$. Bind off in rib. Sew side seams.
Weave in ends.

## SOCKS

With smaller double-pointed needles, cast on 32 $(36,40)$ sts loosely. Divide sts onto 3 needles. Place marker at beginning of round and join, being careful not to twist.
Work in $\mathrm{k} 2, \mathrm{p} 2$ rib for $21 / 2(3,31 / 2)^{\prime \prime}$, changing to larger needles on last row.

Heel flap: On next needle, slip sts so that there are $16(18,20)$ sts on first needle and rest of stitches divided between 2nd and 3rd needles for instep. Working only on the needle with 16 $(18,20)$ sts, work heel flap as follows:
Row 1 (RS): (Slip 1, k1) to end.
Row 2 (WS): Slip 1, purl to end.
Repeat last 2 rows for a total of $16(18,20)$ rows, ending with Row 2.

## Turn heel

Row 1 (RS): Slip 1, k8 (10, 10), ssk, k1, turn.
Row 2 (WS): Slip 1, p3 (5, 3), p2tog, p1, turn.
Row 3: Slip 1, k4 (6, 4), ssk, k1, turn.
Row 4: Slip 1, p5 (7, 5), p2tog, p1, turn.
Continue in this manner until all the sts on the ends of the needle have been worked [10 (12, 12)] sts. End with a WS row.

Pick up sts for gusset: Knit $5(6,6)$ sts of heel. Using free needle, knit across remaining $5(6,6)$ sts of heel and with same needle, pick up 9 ( 9 , 11) sts along edge of heel flap (needle 1). Slip 16 $(18,20)$ instep sts onto 1 needle and knit across (needle 2). With free needle, pick up $9(9,11)$ along edge of heel flap and knit next $5(6,6)$ sts of heel (needle 3). Starting at center of heel, there are $14(15,17)$ sts on needle $1,16(18,20)$ sts on needle 2 , and $14(15,17)$ sts on needle 3.

## Gusset

Round 1: Knit.
Next round: Knit to last 3 sts of needle 1, k2tog, k1; k16 $(18,20)$ sts of needle 2, k1, ssk, knit to end of needle 3.
Repeat the last 2 rounds until there are $8(9,10)$ sts on needles 1 and 3 , and $16(18,20)$ sts on needle $2[32(36,40)$ sts]. Work even until foot measures $3(31 / 2,4)^{\prime \prime}$ or $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ less than desired total length.

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Toe
Next round: (K2, k2tog) around [24 (27,30) sts].
Knit 1 round.
Next round: (K1, k2tog) around [16 $(18,20)$ sts]. Knit 1 round.
Next round: K2tog around $[8(9,10)$ sts]. Cut yarn and thread tail through remaining sts and pull. Fasten off.

Weave in ends.


## Misty Blue Rose Wrap

Designed by Linda Cyr
This Misty Blue Rose Wrap is perfect as an evening wrap shawl. This easy crochet pattern from Red Heart Yarn can be embellished with roses or just left as is. The best thing about this wrap is that you can easily dress it up or down, so it's a great fashion staple.

Shawl measures $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ wide $\times 56$ " long.


## Materials:

- RED HEART ${ }^{\circledR}$ Shimmer: 2 skeins 1810 Royal A.
- RED HEART ${ }^{\oplus}$ Sashay $^{\text {TM }}$ : 1 skein 1934 Rhumba B.
- Crochet Hook: 5mm [US H-8].
- Yarn needle

GAUGE: With A, 4 clusters and 7 rows $=4^{\prime \prime}$ in pattern st.
CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

## SPECIAL STITCH

shell: (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc ) in same st or space.

## WRAP

With A, ch 35
Row 1: Shell in 5th ch from hook, *skip next 3 ch sts, shell in next ch, repeat from * across to last 2 ch sts, skip next ch, dc in last ch, turn-8 shells.
Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout), skip first 3 dc , shell in ch-1 space of each shell across, dc in top of beginning ch, turn.
Repeat row 2 until piece measures 56" from beginning.
Fasten off.
Small Rose (make 4)
Cut a $36^{\prime \prime}$ long piece of B.
Unroll the yarn so that the edge with a row of holes is visible. Treat the row of holes as a chain. Insert the crochet hook into the first hole, skip 2 holes, insert hook into next hole, pull this st through the first st on the hook. Continue to chain in this manner across the piece of yarn. Finish by pulling end of yarn through last st. Roll ruffle to create a rose. Cut an 18 " piece of $\mathbf{A}$, thread onto yarn needle. Sew through rolled rose in several places to secure.

## Large Rose (make 2)

Cut a $60^{\prime \prime}$ piece of B. Complete as small rose. FINISHING
Sew 2 small roses and 1 large rose to each end of wrap.
Weave in ends.

## Princess Shawl

Designed by Jodi Snyder

This beautiful Princess Shawl from Red Heart Yarn was inspired by Princess Kate, who was seen wearing one very similar. A knitted shawl is a great fashion staple, as it's great to wear year round and can easily be dressed up or dressed down.

Shawl measures 62" wide (measured across top edge) and 31" long (measured from center back neck to point). Ruffle adds 5 " to length and width.


## Materials:

- RED HEART ${ }^{\circledR}$ "Soft Yarn ${ }^{\text {®" }}: 4$ balls 9523 Dark Leaf.
- Knitting Needles: 5mm [US 8] circular needle, 32" long.
- Stitch markers
- Removable split ring stitch markers (optional)
- Yarn needle.

GAUGE: 19 sts = 4"; 19 rows = 4". CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needle to obtain the gauge.

NOTE: Ruffle is worked in two pieces to keep the number of stitches on needle from becoming difficult to manage.

## PATTERN STITCH (multiple of 4 sts)

Row 1 (Right Side): *K1, slip 1, k1, yo, pass
slipped st over both knit st and yo, k1; repeat from * across.
Row 2: Purl.
Repeat Rows 1 and 2 for pattern stitch.

## SHAWL

Beginning at bottom point, cast on 5 sts. Purl 1 wrong side row.
Row 1 (Right Side): K2, yo, k1, yo, k2-7 sts.
Row 2: Purl.
Row 3: K2, yo, knit to last 2 sts, yo, k2-9 sts. Row 4: Purl.
Row 5: K2, yo, k2, yo, place marker, k1, place marker, yo, k2, yo, k2-13 sts.
Row 6: Purl, slipping markers as you come to them.
Note : The next four rows establish the pattern.
Each Right Side row will begin K2, yo and end yo, k2. It may be helpful to mark the beginning and end of the first and last complete pattern repeats on each side of the marked center stitch using removable stitch markers. Row 7: K2, yo, work Row 1 of Pattern Stitch to first marker, yo, slip marker, k1, slip marker, yo, work Row 1 of Pattern Stitch to last 2 sts, yo, k2-17 sts.

Row 8: Purl, slipping markers as you come to them.
Row 9: K2, yo, work Row 1 of Pattern Stitch to 2 sts before first marker, k2, yo, slip marker, k1, slip marker, yo, k2, work Row 1 of Pattern Stitch to last 2 sts, yo, k2-21 sts.
Row 10: Purl, slipping markers as you come to them.
Repeat Rows 7-10, until there are 285 sts on needle. End with a Wrong Side row. Bind off loosely, leaving last st on needle.

## Bottom Ruffle

With Right Side facing and beginning at top left corner of shawl with remaining st on needle, pick up and knit 144 stitches across left edge to bottom point ( 145 sts on needle), place maker, pick up and knit 1 stitch in point, place marker, pick up and knit 145 sts across right edge of shawl, ending at top right corner291 sts.
Slip markers as you come to them.
Row 1 (Wrong Side): P1, *yo, p1; repeat from * across-581 sts.
Row 2: Knit to first marker, yo, slip marker, k1,
 slip marker, yo, knit to end - 583 sts.
Row 3: Purl.
Repeat Rows 2 and 3 three more times.
Bind off loosely, leaving last st on needle.

## Top Ruffle

With Right Side facing and beginning at top right edge with remaining st on needle, pick up and knit 8 sts across right side edge of Bottom Ruffle ( 9 sts on needle), pick up and knit 285 sts across top edge of shawl to top left corner of shawl, pick up and knit 9 sts across left side edge of Bottom Ruffle - 303 sts.
Row 1 (Wrong Side): P1, *yo, p1; repeat from * across-605 sts.
Beginning with a knit row (Right Side), work 8 more rows in Stockinette st (knit on Right Side, purl on Wrong Side).
Bind off loosely.
FINISHING
Weave in ends. Wet block if desired.
